




The Member Guest committee has been busy planning a terrific event. Invite a friend to golf in this 2 day tournament.

News From The Turf Care Center

There has been much discussion on the poor overseed on the Palmer course this year. The simple answer is the bermudagrass outgrew and overtook the overseeded ryegrass. But there are a number of contributing factors. Less aggressive prep work on the bermudagrass, lower-end seed rates, warmer than normal temperatures, traffic, follow-up seeding, and timing of growth regulators and fertilizers applications are all factors when it comes to a successful overseed.

Next year we will be more aggressive in prepping our bermudagrass, but it is a fine line not to lose a good bermuda base. It is important to have good bermudagrass base for year-round overseeded golf courses in the desert. Second, we will increase our seed rates to help insure a more competitive chance with the bermudagrass. Third, we will pray for cooler temperatures. Fourth, we will manage traffic better, keeping carts off of the overseed until it can handle the traffic. Fifth, we will do a better job going back in and spot seeding thin areas as needed. Lastly, we will be more aggressive with growth regulators (again a fine line not to setback a good bermuda base) to try and slow the bermudagrass growth if temperatures don't cooperate.

As far as this year goes, we are excited to see the warmer temperatures coming and the grass beginning to grow. We will mow and keep the course very playable, but tight lies will be the conditions we will be playing with. To keep playing conditions neat and clean we will be mowing down the overseeded areas to avoid uneven clumpy lies.

We are on Nematode watch and testing and treating the greens as needed.

Throughout the winter we have done a lot of trimming, cleaning and edging on both courses for a very neat and clean look.

We are looking forward to a great spring and summer golf season coming up. Let's all do our part, repair ball marks, fill divots, follow signage and ropes, double up and show respect to the golf course and your peers.
