Important Message from Oasis Golf Club

As mentioned in previous communications, we continue to address concerns related to single cart riders and the additional wear and tear this practice places on our golf course.



Our maintenance team has done an excellent job with the overseeding process, and current course conditions reflect their hard work and dedication. Many of you have already noticed and enjoyed these improvements during your rounds, and we appreciate your support in helping us protect these conditions.

To further preserve the quality of the course, we are implementing an updated single cart rider policy effective immediately. Members wishing to ride alone in a golf cart will be permitted to do so with the payment of a **\$25 single rider fee per round**.

We would also like to sincerely thank those members who are already doubling up in carts. Your cooperation demonstrates a shared commitment to maintaining the course and ensuring the best possible playing conditions for everyone.

We appreciate your understanding and continued support as we work together to care for Oasis Golf Club. Should you have any questions regarding this policy, please feel free to contact the golf shop.

From the Golf Shop



I'd like to sincerely thank all of you who have offered support, feedback, and encouragement. Your contributions have helped guide many of the improvements we've implemented so far, but there is still more to do. Below are several important policies that need your continued support.

Reinforced Policies

On July 1st of last year, we began enforcing a few new policies and reinforcing some existing ones that have not been consistently followed. These updates were intended to improve fairness, course access, and operational efficiency.

Tee Time Confirmation Policy

- Tee times must be confirmed by 4:00 PM the day before, including the final number of players.
- If, for example, a member books for 8 players and only 4 show up—without canceling or updating the reservation—the member will be charged Member Guest rates for the unused spots, which can be anywhere from \$60 to \$105 based on the time of year.

*Note: When this policy was initially instituted, we were seeing 5 to 8 unused member tee times per day, which translated to 20 to 32 wasted player slots. Because of your efforts we are seeing minimum problems. **Thank You!***

Additional Updates and Reminders

- **Golf Mesquite Partnership Ended:** We have ended our relationship with Golf Mesquite and will no longer accept the Golf Pass.
- **Rate Adjustments:** Outside, group, and local play rates have been increased. This strategic move is designed to reduce course traffic while maintaining or exceeding our financial goals.
- **Single-Rider Cart Policy:** The rise in single-cart riders has significantly impacted course conditions. While we understand both sides of the issue, more carts mean more wear and tear. **Thank you for helping with your ongoing commitment to this policy.**

I want to express my sincere thanks to all members who have shared suggestions, ideas, or concerns. Whether positive or critical, your input is always welcome and plays a crucial role in the success of Oasis Golf Club. If any member has questions, concerns, or suggestions—whether you've been with us for 25 years or just 2 months—please know that my door is always open. I am committed to listening, learning, and working together to make this club the best it can be.

From the Turf Care Center



Since we last spoke a lot of good things have been happening. The summer weather was much better this year and put a lot less strain on the golf course and on the staff. This great weather continued through the overseed and is still great to today.

We were able to enlarge the white and yellow tee box on #16 Palmer by combining them and making one large tee. We picked up about 300 square feet of teeing ground which is helpful on par 3 tee boxes. Over the past 5 years we have enlarged the par 3 tee boxes on Canyons #4, #9 and #17. On the Palmer course we have enlarged the tee boxes on #9 and #16. This has helped to keep our par 3 tee boxes in the best possible playing conditions under heavy use.

We shored up the lake wall on #6 Canyons to help prevent any more undermining and it is much safer for our members and guest. Aesthetically it looks better as well.

We have received some new equipment including fairway/rough mowers, bunker rakes, spray units and rollers for the greens.

The overseed went well this year due to a variety of factors. Number one Mother Nature cooperated and she is always the main factor when it comes to overseeding. Second, is our healthy stand of bermudagrass that we work very hard at keeping healthily (aerating, staking, roping, managing cart traffic, fertilizing, etc.). Third, we raised our seed rate from 450 lbs/acre to 650 lbs/acre which has helped immensely in providing a thicker stand of grass. And last our staff has done an amazing job as they always do. They take pride in their work and are very dedicated to provide a great product.

We have focused on improving the overall playability of the golf course. Not only are the overseeded turf areas thicker, but we overseeded more area around the greens, and widened many of the fairways. We are mowing some areas at a higher cut to help balls from rolling into hazards or thin non-overseed areas. We have been working on the bunkers to improve there playability by adding and redistributing the sand as needed. We feel the playability of the golf course is better than in the past few years.

We will work hard every day to provide you with the best possible playing conditions. Please help with repairing ball marks, sanding divots, 2 carts per foursome and overall caring for the golf course.

HELP KEEP OUR COURSE AND MEMBERS HEALTHY

Please try to remember to apply the 90° rule on the course throughout the year. This practice helps protect our fairways, ensuring they remain in excellent condition for all players to enjoy.

Under this rule, golfers are required to keep their golf carts on the cart path until they are even with their ball on the hole they're playing. Once they reach this point, they can turn (at a 90-degree angle) and drive directly across the fairway to their ball. After taking their shot, they should return the cart directly back to the cart path and continue down the path to their next shot.

The 90° rule is a simple yet effective way to preserve the beauty and functionality of the course while enhancing the overall golfing experience for everyone.

Also, whenever possible there should always be two ladies per cart – this practice also ensures preservation of our course and reduces wear and tear on our turf. **If you are feeling unwell, please prioritize everyone's health and stay home.**

Finally, make sure you fix divots on the course with sand and try to fix ball marks on our greens. The course is in great condition, and these small things can really go a long way in keeping our course beautiful for the entire season!
