From the Turf Care Center

Spring officially gets here March 20th but we have had spring like temperatures since December of 2025. For Bermuda grass growers this is a huge benefit and gives us the opportunity to get it greening and growing as quickly as possible. We will take full advantage of this and use all of our tools and skills to promote Bermuda grass growth and transition out of the winter season.

We continue to focus on daily course conditioning and course set-up. Please enjoy the game. Focus on birdies and pars rather than bogeys and bunkers. Take time to smell the Cactus.

Thank you for your input, comments and question for our new WHY section. This month seems to be bunker talk. Hold on here we go.

Why are the bunkers too wet, too dry, too rocky, too shallow, too fluffy, or too firm? Why is there not enough sand in the bunkers? Why is there too much sand in the bunkers? Why is there dirt in the bunkers? Why is the lip too steep in the bunker? Why is there no lip in the bunker? Why are the bunkers not consistent in depth, wetness, dryness, particle size? And etc. AND, why are the rakes inside the bunkers? Why are the rakes outside of the bunkers? Why is the rake handle hot? Why is the rake handle wood? Why are there not enough rakes in the bunkers? Why are there so many rakes in the bunkers? And etc. I hope I didn't miss anything.

Bunkers, by definition up to 2019 were defined as a HAZARD consisting of a prepared area of ground, often a hollow, from which turf or soil has been removed and replaced with sand or like. Today the word Hazard has been removed from the definition. The idea of a BUNKER is to CHALLENGE a golfer's ABILITY that requires specific techniques to escape.

Believe it or not the cost to maintain bunkers can far outweigh the cost to maintain greens. This has never made sense to me that more money would be spent on a HAZARD

(pre 2019) than on a putting green. Sunday golf on TV has spoiled us into thinking that bunkers should be consistent, perfect playing surface that allow an easy shot every time. We know it is a problem when the best players in the world choose to aim at bunkers because they know it will be more consistent lye than tall uneven grass surrounding the area. This is Sunday golf, not reality golf.

The bunkers are 30+ years old and have some contamination in them. We manage the sand to help provide a decent playing surface including: raking redistributing, adding, removing, edging and etc. We try to space rakes evenly and provide a user friendly amount. We use rakes with a rubber handle to lessen the heat impact. We do our best to maintain these PREPARED AREAS (post 2019). We know the bunkers are less than perfect and probably need a total renovation, but that is probably not going to happen in the near future.

Lakes are also a hazard; I hope I'm retired before we start getting questions about consistency, depths, wetness and lip size on lake edges. If all else fails contact Joe, Troy or Scott Smith for a bunker lesson to help enjoy the game.

Tuesday April 28: Golf, Closing Luncheon & Board Elections

Please join us for our Closing Luncheon on Tuesday, April 28, to celebrate the conclusion of the regular OWGA season with an ABCD Florida Scramble followed by lunch and a full board meeting.

At the luncheon, we will elect our new OWGA Board, with nominations prepared by the organizing committee, allowing members to vote for their representatives. The Board is composed of five elected officers: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Tournament/Special Events Coordinator, with the Vice President moving to President and the immediate Past President serving as an advisor.

We also select the important role of the Ambassador -- Charlie Houmes who did an outstanding job of making sure our ladies were sent handwritten cards when they faced tough situations and wonderful birthday cards every month. Thank you Charlie!

The President will invite floor nominations during the meeting. If multiple nominees emerge for any position, a secret ballot will determine the winner, with a tie resulting in a second vote.

The outgoing President's term concludes at the end of April, with the new President assuming responsibilities on May 1.

Our by-laws stipulate that the OWGA regular season runs from October 1 to September 30, but summer golf will continue with tee times on Tuesday mornings. We have changed the by-laws to have \$1 of summer league go back into the OWGA account, similar to the regular season.

We also plan to update the OWGA bylaws to implement a 10% take from all major golf events. Currently, there are 8 to 10 events where the OWGA does not receive any funding, and this change will ensure we receive support from all major events in the 2026-2027 season.

The closing luncheon also provides a platform for members to voice concerns or address the group, so please reach out to a board member if you wish to be added to the agenda.

You will receive a registration form in late summer or early fall to update your contact information and pay your league fees for the 2026-2027 season.

Finally, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to our outgoing OWGA Board of Jackie Truskolaski (President), Lynda Moody (Treasurer), Julie Pershing (Secretary), Debbie Young (Events Coordinator), and Charlie Houmes (Ambassador) for their leadership and dedication to the women's association.

Oasis & OWGA Club Championship April 21-22

The Oasis Club Championship event open to all Oasis Golf Club members.

Oasis members who belong to the OWGA and have played at least six rounds during the regular season are eligible to participate in the gross and net flighted OWGA Club Championship. The cost is \$10 per day (\$20 for the two-day event).

Eligible OWGA members participating in the league Club Championship will be flighted by handicaps and payouts awarded for gross and net scores in each flight.

OWGA members who haven't played six times can still play in the event, but it's only for the trophy and parking spot -- they will not be eligible to win OWGA money. The cost is \$10 per day (\$20 for the two-day event) to help off-set costs.

All women Oasis Members who are not members of the OWGA but competing in the Club Championship will be charged \$10 per day (\$20 per the two-day event) to help off-set costs.

Prizes and recognition for winning the Oasis Club Championship include:

- **Non-OWGA Player:** A trophy and a reserved parking space
- **Eligible OWGA PLAYER:** A trophy, reserved parking space, plus a cash prize funded by OWGA dues

From the Golf Shop

Dear Members,

As we continue to look for ways to improve pace of play and overall enjoyment on the course, I would like to introduce a concept called **"Call Holes"** on our Par 3's when we have three or more groups waiting on the tee.

Here is how it will work:

When there are three or more groups on a Par 3 in which two of the groups are waiting on the tee, both groups will tee off at the same time. After hitting their tee shots, each group will make their way to the green and mark their golf balls. The first foursome will then proceed to putt out. The second foursome will already be in position and ready to putt as soon as the first group clears the green.

I have personally played this format at a course in Thailand and it worked extremely well in keeping play moving without disrupting the flow of the round. We would like to try implementing this on a trial basis and gather feedback from you, our Members, on how it is working.

If you arrive at a Par 3 and see outside play backed up, please let those groups know what we are trying to accomplish and encourage them to participate in the Call Hole format.

If you have any questions, concerns, or feedback, please feel free to speak with me directly.


